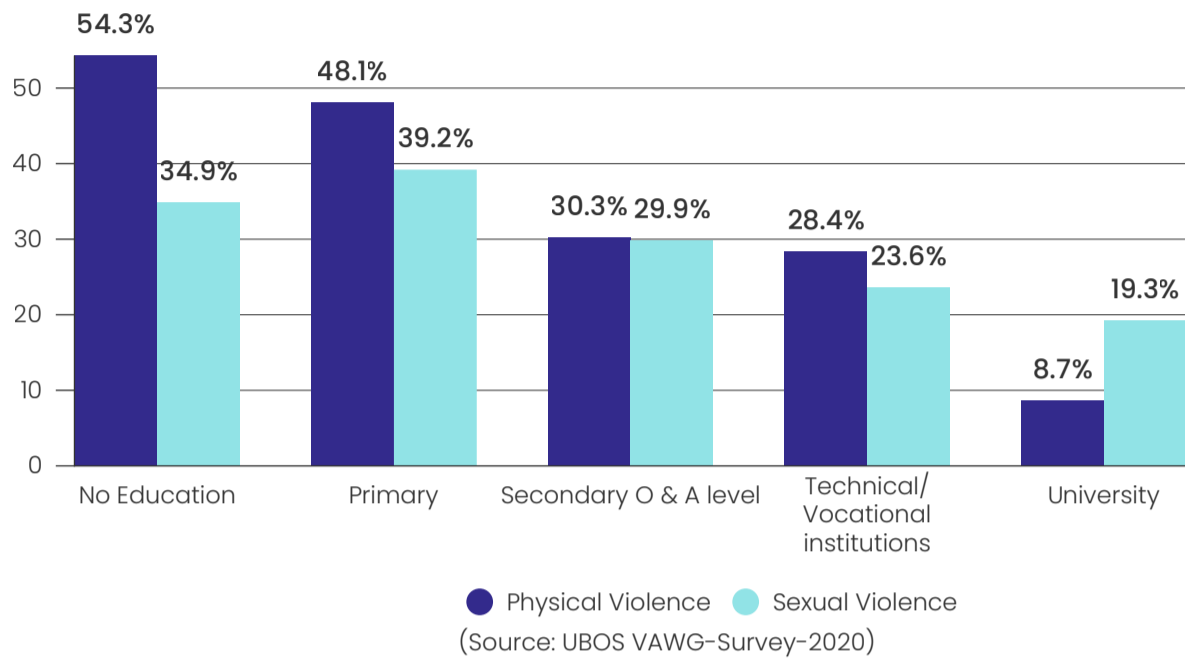

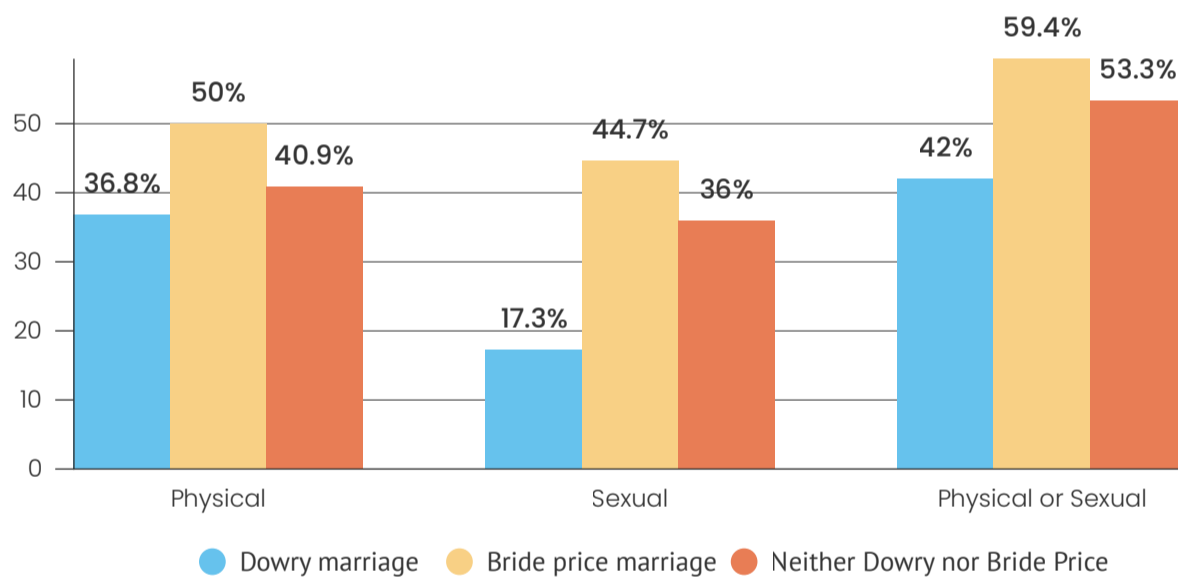

Prevalence of intimate partner violence by Marital status

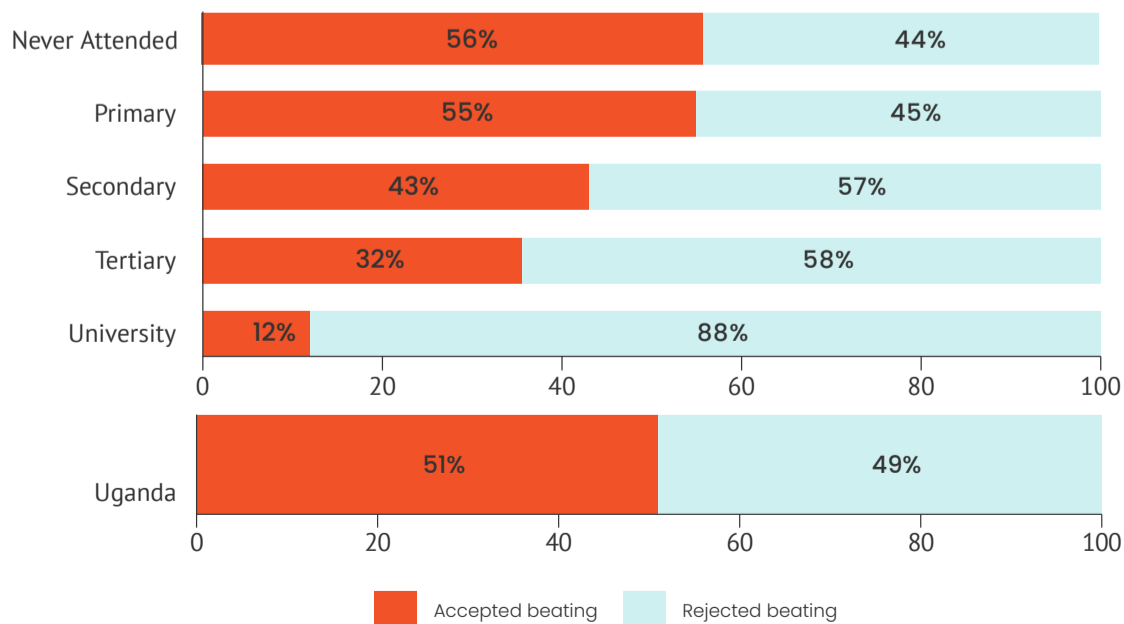


6 out of 10

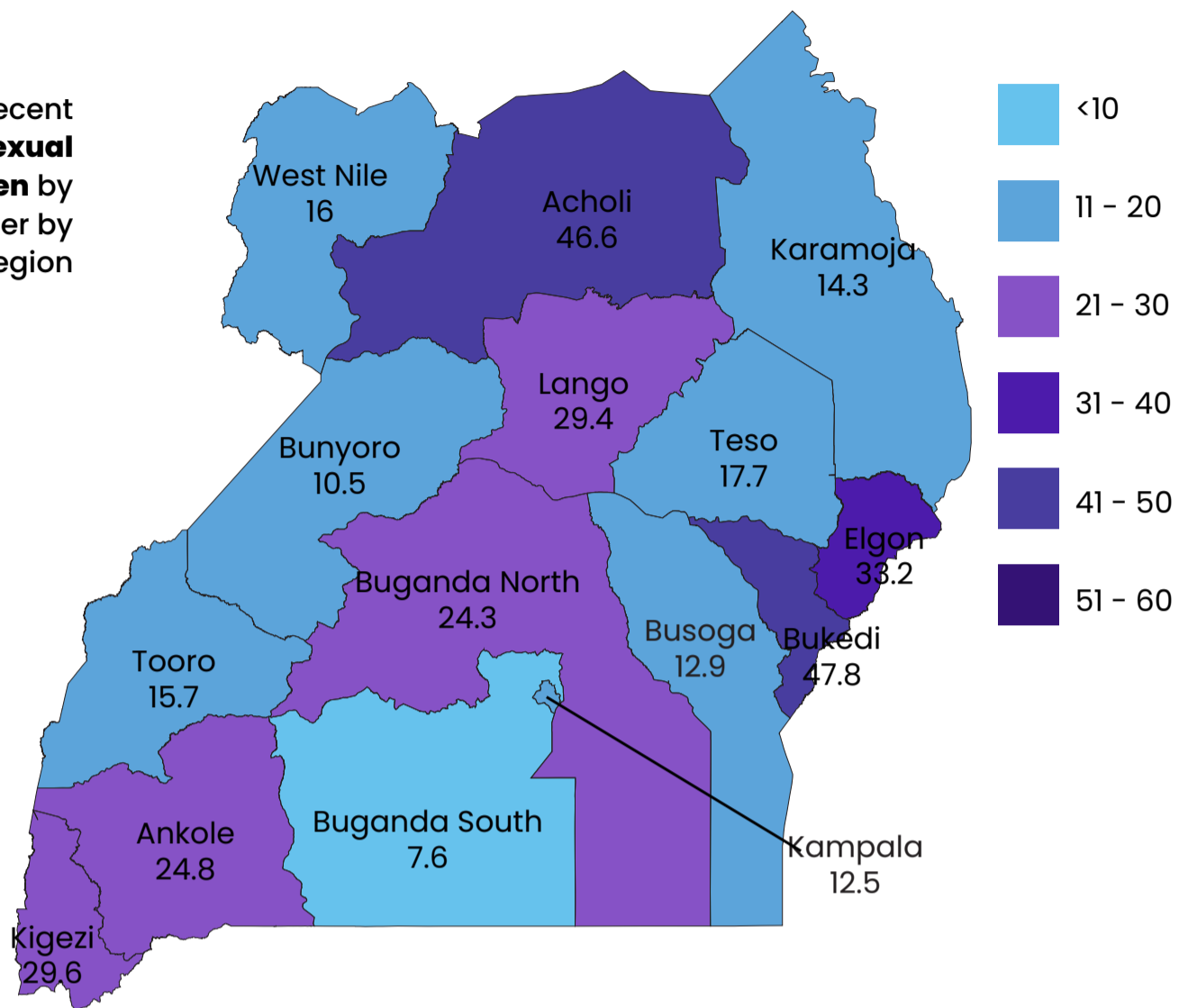
The level of physical violence reduces with increase in the level of education.

On Average, 51% of women in Uganda have accepted being beaten by their spouses

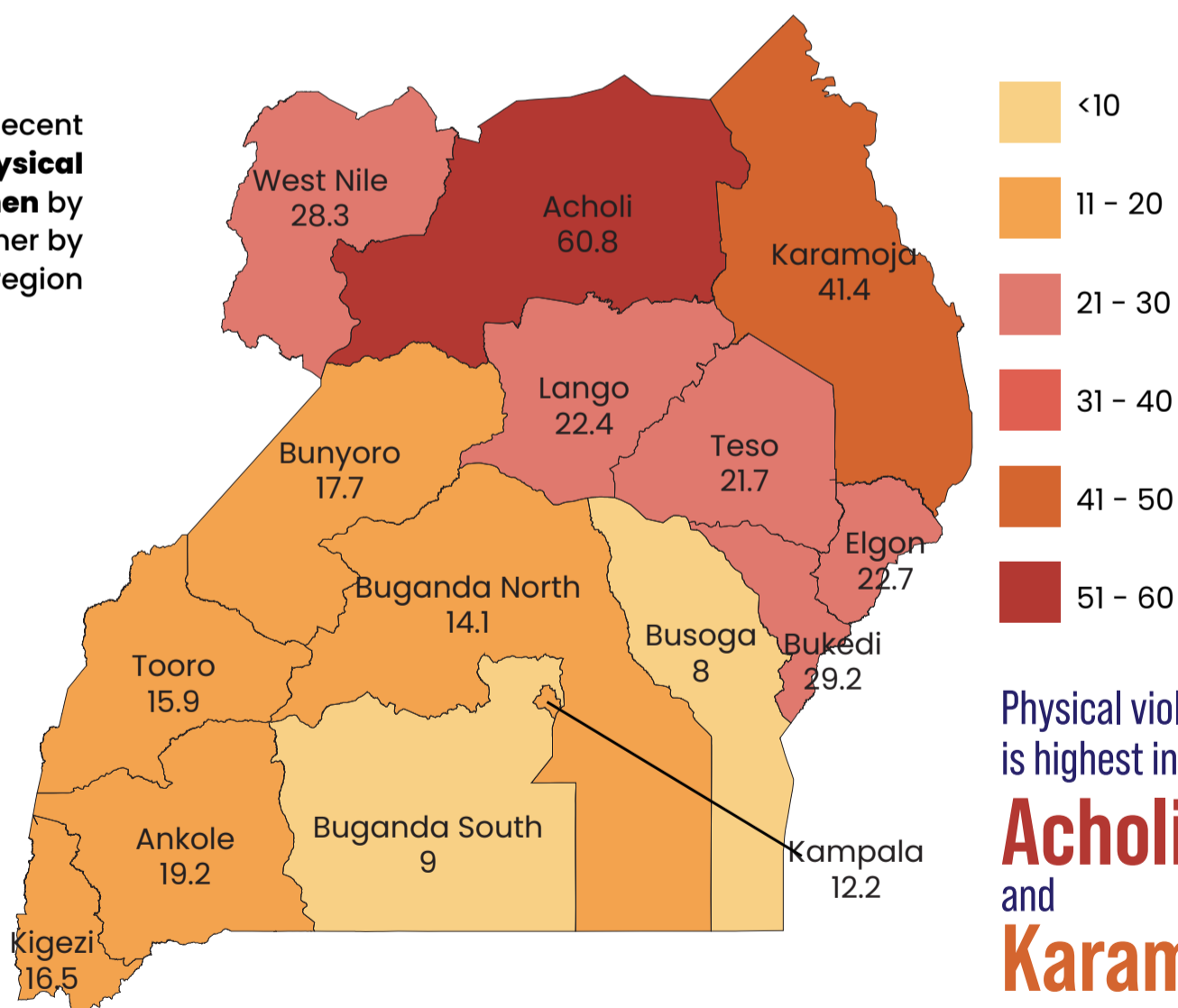

Prevalence rate of recent experience of **sexual violence against women** by an intimate partner by sub-region



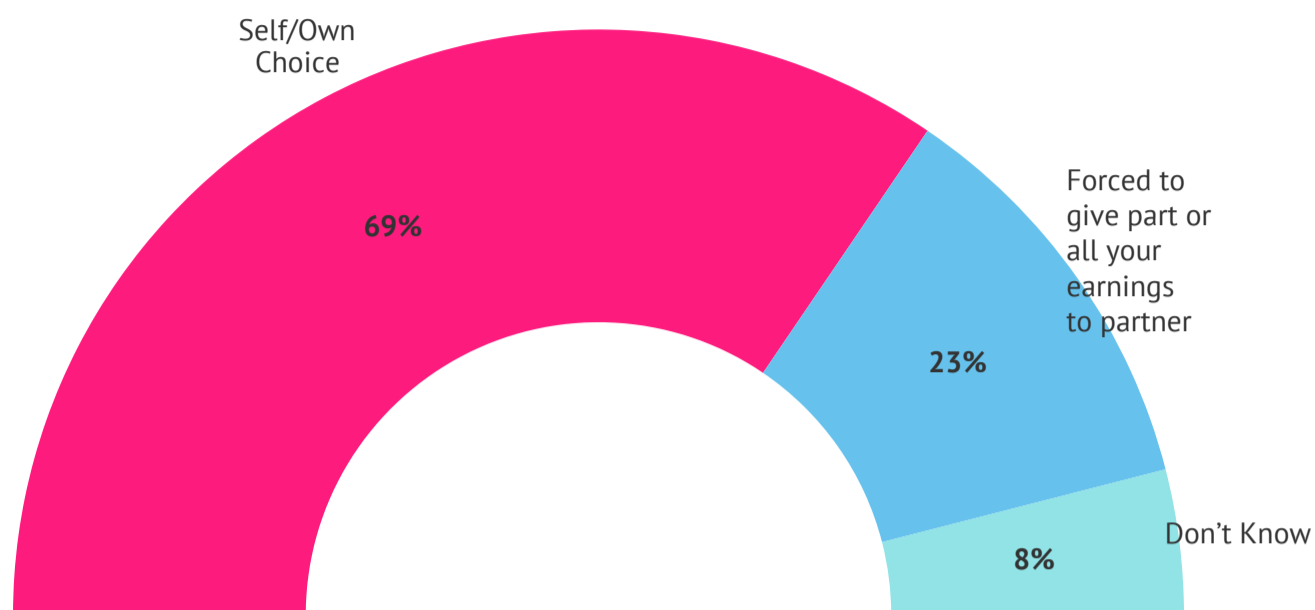
Prevalence rate of recent experience of **physical violence against women** by an intimate partner by sub-region

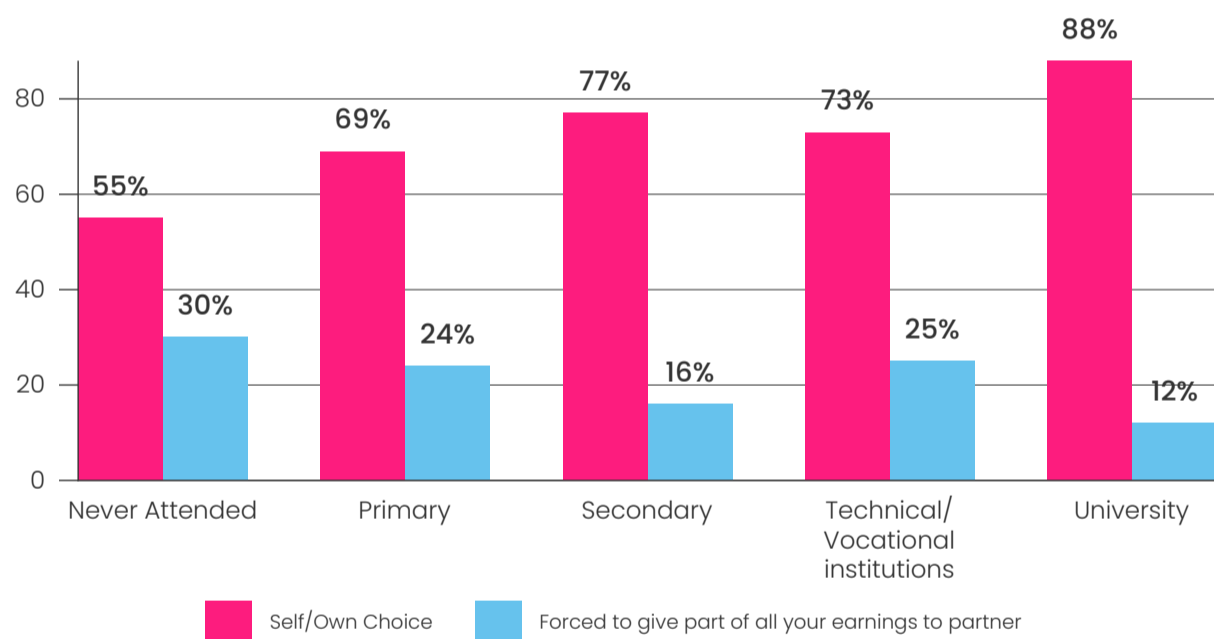
Women's control over their earnings

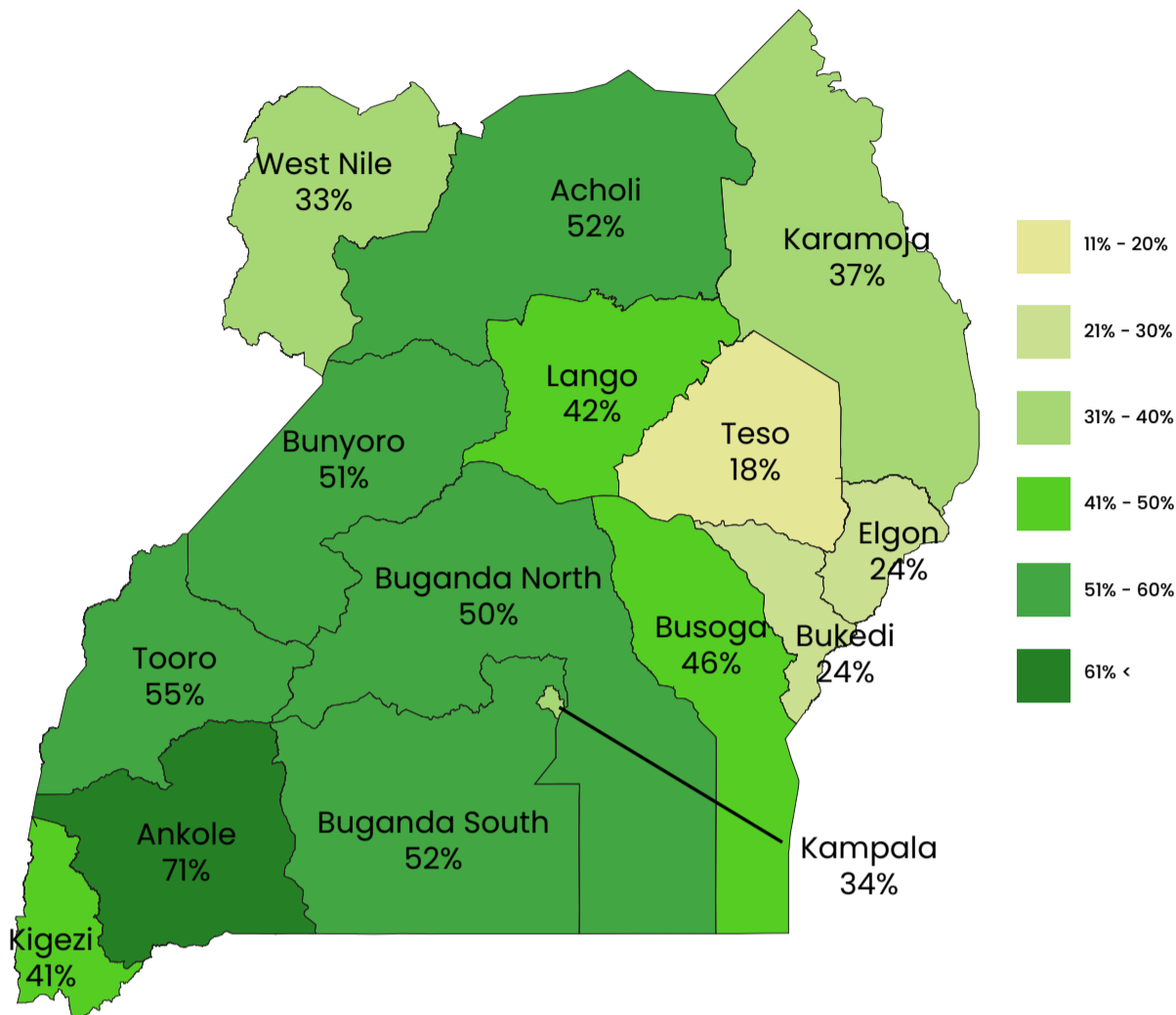
Womens' ability to spend their earnings increases with increase in the level of education

Three in every ten of the women that never attended school (30%) are forced to give part or all of their earnings to their husbands compared to 12% of women with University education

Physically Abused women who fought back by Region

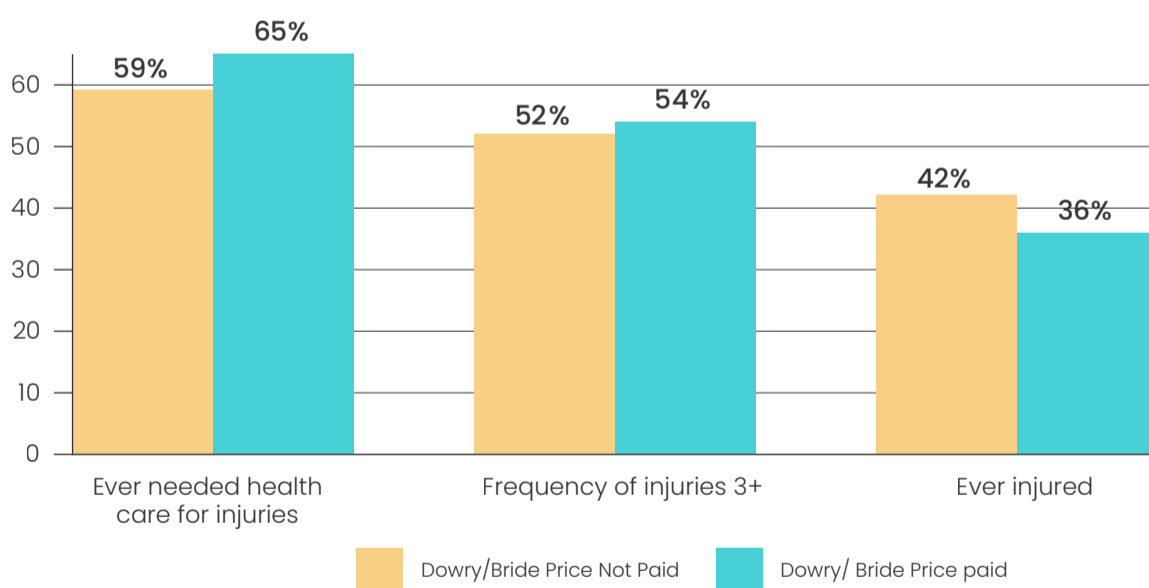

71% Of Physically Abused Women in Ankole region fight back

Every 7 in 10 of the women (71%) physically abused in Ankole region fight back. These are followed by Tooro (55%), Acholi (52%) among others.

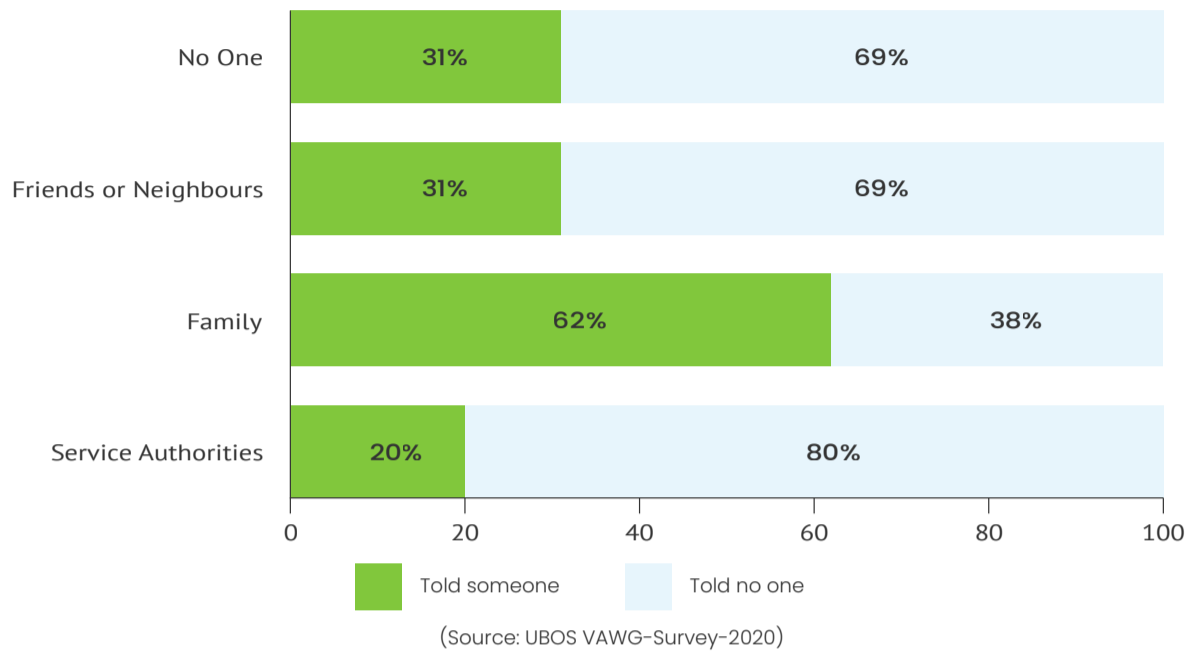
Seeking healthcare for injuries due to intimate partner violence by marital status.

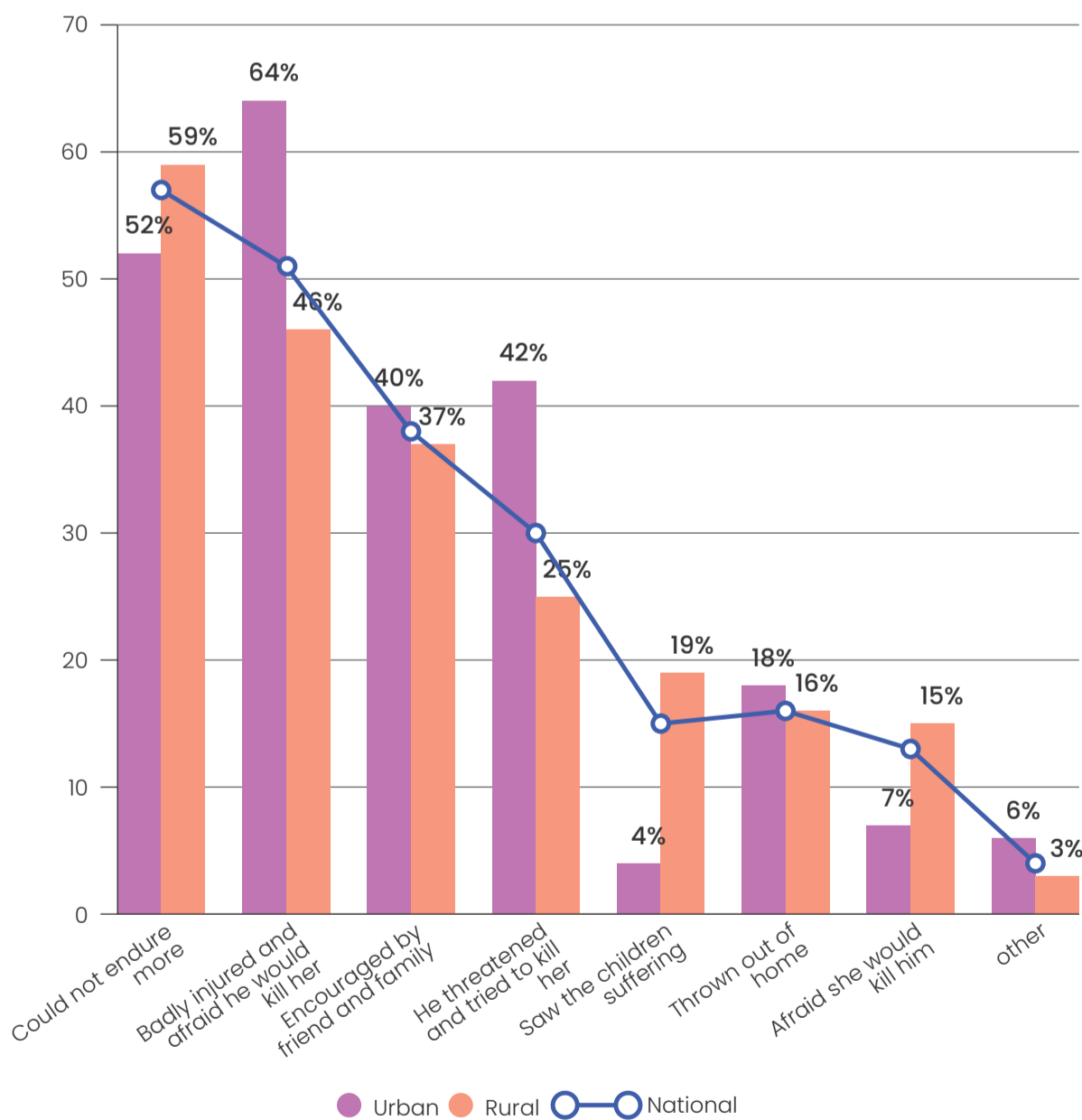
65% of women whose **bride price was paid** needed healthcare for the injuries due to partner violence compared to **59%** of women whose **bride price was not paid**

80% Of the women who had ever been abused told no one

Reasons for seeking Help



Women in Urban (42%) than Rural areas (25%) sought help because their partner had threatened or tried to kill them.

More than half of the women in Urban and Rural areas sought help because they could not endure.
