

Intimate partner violence reduces by increase in level of education


Prevalence of intimate partner violence by Marital status

The level of physical violence reduces with increase in the level of education.


On Average, 51% of women in Uganda have accepted being beaten by their spouses



Womens' ability to spend their earnings increases with increase in the level of education


Three in every ten of the women that never attended school (30%) are forced to give part or all of their earnings to their husbands compared to 12% of women with University education







Women in Urban (42%) than Rural areas (25%) sought help because their partner had threatened or tried to kill them.
