

Unpaid Care Work



45% **OF WOMEN** take care of children, elderly or disabled all the time

45% of women take care of children, elderly or disabled all the time compared to 12% men



46% 33% OF MEN OF WOMEN are in unpaid care are in unpaid care work work

There are more women in Unpaid care work than men.

Time spent Daily on Unpaid care work by Gender



6.6hrs 5.1 hrs Spent by **women** on unpaid care work work

Women spend 6.6 hours daily on Unpaid care work compared to 5.1 hours spent by men.

Women spend more time on Unpaid care work than men throughout the day



The peak hours of unpaid care work are in the morning where women spend 27% of their time on unpaid work compare to men (12%)



The next peak hours are around midday and women spend 29% of their time on Unpaid work compared to men (6%)



The last peak hours are in the evening and women spend 30% of their time on unpaid work compared to men (7%)

30 25 -20 - On Average, Men and women spend the same amount of time on unproductive work on both weekdays and weekends. This includes socializing, religious practices, culture, and leisure among others.

On average, Women Spend more time on unpaid care work than men during both weekends and weekdays
